Interrogative	Short answers
Is there a tomato in the fridge? Are there any eggs in the fridge?	Yes, there is. / No, there isn't. Yes, there are. / No, there aren't.

There is an apple.

There are apples.

There isn't a potato.
There isn't any honey.

Is there an egg in the fridge? Yes, there is.

Are there any raspberries in the fridge? No, there aren't.

Quantifiers: a lot, some, a few, a little, isn't / aren't any
