How often do they swim?	They never swim.

You're good at singing.	You aren't good at singing.
He's good at singing.	He isn't good at singing.
She's good at singing.	She isn't good at singing.
It's good at singing.	It isn't good at singing.
We're good at singing.	We aren't good at singing.
You're good at singing.	You aren't good at singing.
They're good at singing.	They aren't good at singing.
