

VERBS + PREPOSITIONS

ARRIVE IN → FOR CITIES OR COUNTRIES (ARRIVED IN PARIS)

ARRIVE AT → BUILDINGS (ARRIVED AT THE HOTEL)

WAIT FOR → SOMETHING
SOMEONE (WAIT FOR MY FRIEND)

DEPEND ON → SOMETHING
SOMEONE (IT DEPENDS ON THE WEATHER)

AGREE WITH → SOMEONE (I AGREE WITH YOU)

ASK FOR → SOMETHING (I ASKED FOR A COKE)

INVITE TO → INVITE SOMEONE TO SOMETHING (I INVITE TOM TO THE CINEMA)

PAY FOR → PAY FOR SOMETHING (SHE IS GOING TO PAY FOR THE MEAL)

SPEAK TO (SOMEONE) ABOUT (SOMETHING) → I SPEAK TO MICHAEL ABOUT

SPEND | money | time | ON → HIS BEHAVIOR

SPEND | time | ON → I DON'T SPEND MUCH TIME ON THE PARK

WRITE TO SOMEONE → I HAVE TO WRITE TO EMILY, SHE IS LIVING IN L.A.

WORRY ABOUT SOMETHING → DON'T WORRY ABOUT ME, I AM FINE

FELL IN LOVE WITH SOMEONE → HE FELL IN LOVE WITH HER

THINK ABOUT SOMETHING → FROM THE MOMENT THEY MET

THINK OF SOMEONE → I AM THINKING ABOUT BUYING A CAR

THINK OF SOMEONE → I THINK OF HER WHEN I LISTEN TO THIS SONG

* IF A PREPOSITION IS FOLLOWED BY A VERB, THE VERB ENDS IN "-ING".
