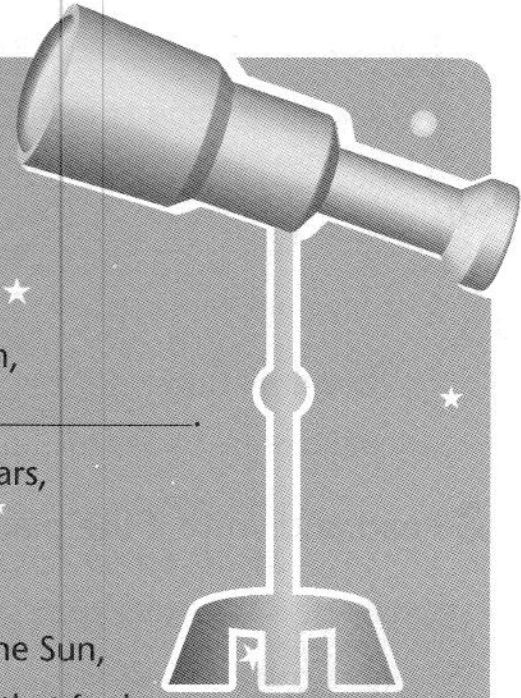

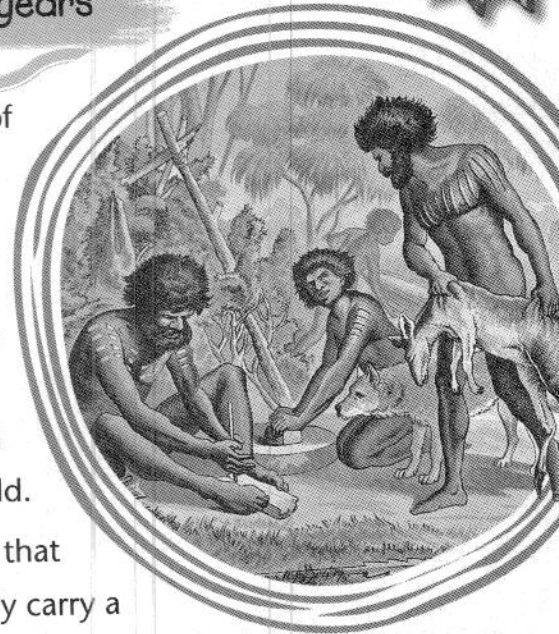

- The (1) _____ of central Australia is one of the hottest places on the planet. So people can't possibly live there, can they? The Aboriginal people of Australia can! Some now live in towns, but many continue the lifestyle of their ancestors, who knew how to live in the most hostile conditions. Experts estimate Australian Aboriginal culture to be at least 40,000 (2) _____ old.
- Australian Aborigines are nomadic, which means that they move from place to place. They don't usually carry a (3) _____ with them. They sleep in the open air and keep warm by sleeping with their dogs between two small fires.
- The Aborigines eat what they can find or catch as they move around. Traditionally, women collect food such as vegetables, roots, eggs and (4) _____, as well as small animals such as snakes and lizards. Men hunt for bigger creatures, like emus and (5) _____.

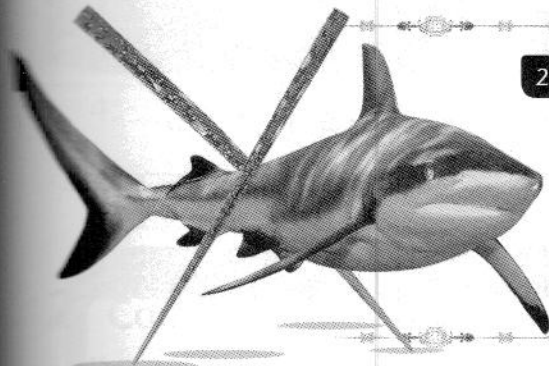
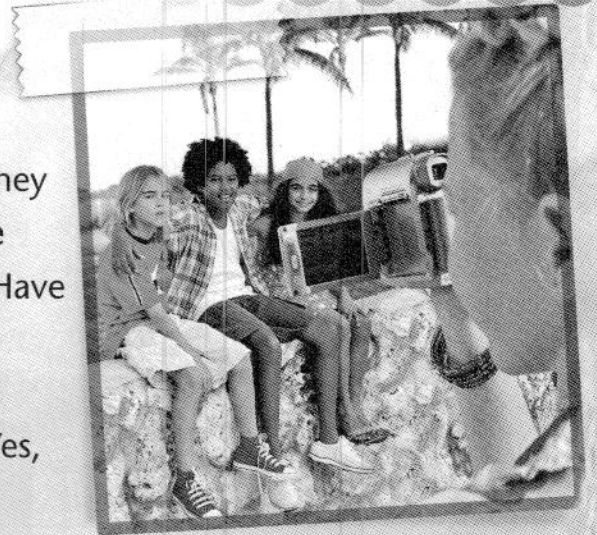

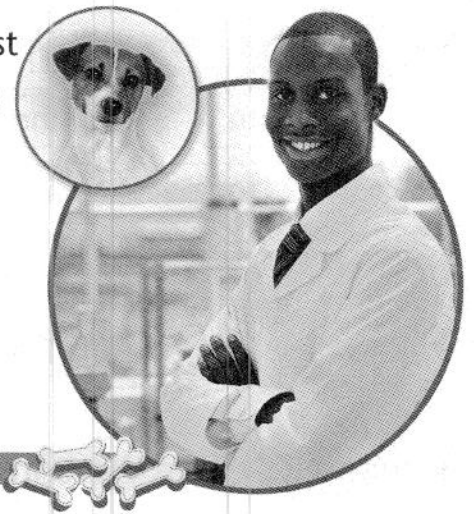
